MWRD COMMISSIONER DEBRA SHORE ENDORSES DAVID SCHROEDER FOR STATE REPRESENTATIVE

Chicago, IL – Cook County Metropolitan Water Reclamation District Commissioner Debra Shore endorsed David Schroeder in the Democratic primary for State Representative in the 5th District.
